We don't believe people can be judged by their online presence as that is only a fraction of their humanity. And just the same, we don't feel we can judge you solely by your spying activities. We trust that you are not intentionally trying to harm anyone and that your existence is the expression of our own mistrust therefore we will work to create more trust in the world and you can trust that we will resist your current activities nonviolently because we love you. (aka, our emails + phone calls to others)

In our next letter, we look forward to co-imagining with you the way to achieve ^{real} security through nonviolence.
