Stephanie points out that in 2013 Metta (and she herself, I might add!) were 31 years old, which I believe was the age at which Dante came to his senses in a dark wood and began his journey to -- eventually -paradise. It does seem when you look at the world today that we are descending into a darkness through which we will have to pass before we enter into the light.

Yet, at the same time, nonviolence is growing in extent and sophistication all over the world. Hence the critical importance of nonviolence education -- our work. The more people can recognize what nonviolence has to offer and is already offering the more safely

As part of the preparation for our upcoming retreat, I've been asked to share with you some highlights of the year 2013, which was a busy one at

- In 2013 we were able to create a short-term staff position to work with us as our first **Director of Publications**. This staff member keywordindexed my by now considerable collected writings and we then began the process of compiling and formatting "e-shorts" -- a process we expect to continue later this year and forward. As of the end of 2013, we had published one e-short, A Bright Future: Nonviolence and Human Evolution and republished in e-book form two Metta publications: Hope or Terror and the popular Meditation for Peacemakers.
 - We are particularly pleased with the production of three videos that the UN, through our friend Mel Duncan, asked us to contribute to the UNITAR curriculum used to train UN peacekeepers.
 - In the area of media and journalism we concluded our second year of Peace Paradigm Radio that airs on KWMR in Point Reves and is put up on our site shortly after, as well as being picked up by a few other stations, a process which at some point we would like to expand systematically. We were very pleased, in this connection, to hire an excellent Director of Communications and Outreach who launched the very attractive e-magazine (one edition did go onto paper), Emergence. (While Bijoyeta has had to step down for family health reasons, at this moment [Nov. 4] we are negotiating with an excellent replacement).
 - Education. While virtually everything we do is education in a sense, we were extremely pleased to appoint Stephanie Knox Cubbon, a tireless contributor in this field who understands our message very well, as our first Director of Education. Stephanie (KC) designed and conducted a successful pilot certificate course in nonviolence with six foundation participants as well as creating a series of study grants from guides for the Roadmap. the following
